SAAS member Rydal hits the big screen!

Viewers of Sky Arts Landscape Artist of the Year may have spotted SAAS member **Rydal Hanbury** in Series 9 Episode 3 (now available on Sky Arts catch-up). Rydal joined seven other painters and 50 'wildcard' artists to paint a landscape including Hever Castle Loggia. Her impressive painting was one of three chosen by the judges at the end of the episode, which was won by Deepa Goswami.

Rydal 'loved' the experience of participating in the show. As a keen plein air painter, often seen on the streets of St Albans, she is no stranger to changing weather and an audience watching over her shoulder. The organisation of the day and behind-the-scenes support

were amazingly good. The friendly atmosphere and the presence of close family members made for a great day overall.

The hardest part was creating a painting in four hours, while stopping to answer questions and chat at critical moments. 'It was difficult to move back into my non-verbal 'painting space' after speaking,' Rydal explained. 'We were also a long way from the building so it was hard to see all the detail.' When the presenter and one of the judges took a boat on the lake, she included them in her picture – the first time this has ever happened.

Rydal would encourage anyone who likes the idea of appearing in the show to go for it. If you are not selected as one of the main artists you might get a place as a 'wildcard'. This group clearly has enormous fun and one of them gets a chance to be selected for the semi-final.

Gary Spencer's evening of critique and compositional advice


We are looking forward to having Gary Spencer (a judge at last year's exhibition) to run our critique
